Erase (conviction and serious professional misconduct)

Dr. Colman-Archer:

The Committee cannot fail to be gravely concerned by the evidence which they have heard today concerning your three convictions, <sup>and</sup> your ~~repeated failures~~ <sup>behaviour during</sup> to

~~provide necessary medical attention to~~  
~~employment as a gen. registration house officer~~  
~~two patients and of your inappropriate~~  
~~behaviour towards professional~~  
~~colleagues.~~  
*in two hospitals.*

The Committee have judged you to have been guilty of serious professional misconduct in relation to the facts which have been proved against you in charge A. By reason of that finding and of the convictions proved against you they have directed the Registrar to erase your name from the Register.

With immediate suspension

The Committee have further determined that it is necessary ~~for the protection~~  
~~of members of the public/~~ and would be  
~~in your own best interests/~~ that your  
registration will be suspended

forthwith; and they have accordingly  
ordered that your registration be  
suspended forthwith.

The effect of the foregoing direction  
and order is that, unless you exercise  
your right of appeal, your registration  
will be suspended from today and your  
name will be erased from the Register 28  
days from today.
